Ilulissat is known as the capital of icebergs, and you will see why as you paddle your way through the gigantic ice fjord just south of the city. You can smoothly slice your way through the water while keeping your eyes open for whales - 15 species regularly inhabit Greenlandic waters in the summertime!

There will be morning guided kayak groups on several days. In the evenings, you can experience the serenity of the landscape as you calmly paddle your way among the "floating mountains under the extraordinary midnight sun.

Whether it is sunny or cloudy, the icebergs offer beautiful reflections – the sun will emphasize their sparkle, while clouds evoke the deep blue colour of the ice. Your guide will provide information on the ice sheet and its glaciers, as well as the story of the original kayak that was made from sealskin and wood and will answer any other questions you may have.

Thanks to our certified kayak guides, modern equipment, and safety protocols, it is possible for you to paddle through this remarkable landscape. The tours are open to all levels, whether you are a master paddler or it's your first time in a kayak. A comfortable and safe experience is a priority.

Only a few places in Greenland are as beautiful as the Eqi Glacier, which ends in the fjord 80kms north of Ilulissat. By boat, it is possible to get very close to the glacier and experience huge pieces of ice breaking off (called 'calving'). The sounds are enormous and the sight of icebergs crashing into the water is breathtaking.

The route heads north along the coast, passing Bredebugt, the settlement of Oqaatsut, and the big fjord system called Pakitsoq, where whales and seals are often seen. Further along you will pass through the Ataa Strait, surrounded by steep mountains and boasts waterfalls and a rich bird life.

Upon reaching Eqi, the boat anchors for about an hour in front of the glacier. Whilst waiting for the ice to calve, you can dig into your packed lunch.

SAIL TO OQAATSUT SETTLEMENT – 01 & 02 JUNE 2025



The tour starts by boat from Ilulissat to Oqaatsut; a 30-minute boat tour sailing among the gigantic icebergs from the Ilulissat Icefjord on their path north of Ilulissat. on arrival in Oqaatsut, the guide will take you on a tour of the settlement where you will see the school, church, and fish factory of Oqaatsut.

The guide will tell you all about living in a small settlement-community and the history of Oqaatsut. The settlement tour ends at Restaurant H8 Explorer where lunch will be served made from local ingredients. You will then have time to explore the area for an hour or two before the boat sails back to Ilulissat.

Afterwards the boat which will take you back to Ilulissat. On the route back there is plenty of scenery to enjoy. The 70 million year old volcanic Disko Island to the west and the green mainland to the east.

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
